Course Description and Objectives:

While primarily a grammar course, this course will also heavily emphasize writing while focusing on two other skills: listening and reading. Emphasis will be placed on continued development of grammar skills with the end goal of writing essays, longer research papers and academic responses that may be incorporated into academic writing.

Student Learning Objectives:

- 1) Students will use correct grammar, vocabulary, and sentence structure for this level to communicate information.
- 2) Using process techniques, students will be able to write paragraphs with a clear beginning, middle and end.

The writing component of this class, grammar will be applied using a free-write method to develop sentence and paragraph construction. Additional materials and handouts will be given in class.

Course Requirements

- 1) Attend classes
 - You must attend class regularly. Except emergencies or valid excuses, you must attend 85% of the classes to pass.
 - You must come to class on time. Three tardies (being late) equal one absence.

- If you know you will miss a class because of an emergency and/or illness, business trip, or an unexpected change in plans, you must notify me by e-mail or leave a voice mail before class. It is your responsibility to find out what you missed in class and to complete missing assignments.

2) Be prepared

- You must attend class regularly and complete all assignments.
- Bring all the things you need for the class: textbook, pens, pencils, dictionary, notebook, homework, questions, etc.
- Turn off your cell phones (including vibrator tone) before coming to class and cell phones must not visibly be seen (no text messaging in class).
- If you must accept a cell phone call in class, please step outside of the classroom so you will not disturb the class.

3) Participate

- You must actively participate in class and be cooperative and supportive of your classmates, as well as be respectful to me.
- Everybody can participate and enjoy themselves during this course. If you do not participate, then you cannot improve. The best way to learn English is to participate. Share your ideas and beliefs, have an opinion, agree and disagree.
- Ask questions if you don't understand something or need repetition. There are NO dumb questions!
- In other words, just participate!

4) Language

- Use English! This course: *Intermediate English Grammar & Writing* is to help you develop good English language skills, which you cannot do, unless you practice English. The use of your native language will not help you improve your English abilities.

Grading and Evaluation Policy:

This course is a graded course, to receive a passing grade of C or better you must do the required work and earn enough at least 700 points to avoid repeating this course.

The final grade is based on averaged grades from assignments, tests, collaborative groups/pair projects, and the final examination. Each student may achieve an average of 100% (1000 points). The following scale will be used:

Final Examination:
