ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN PACIFIC UNION COLLEGE AND CALIFORNIA PREPARATORY COLLEGE

Pacific Union College (PUC) has developed a special agreement with California Preparatory College (CPC) regarding the transferability of courses. This agreement is in effect for courses taken at CPC during the time when the college does not have regional accreditation but is actively working toward the attainment of this goal.

When a student transfers from CPC to PUC, the student's CPC transcripts will be analyzed and transfer credit will be granted as follows:

- Any course on this articulation agreement will transfer at full value to PUC, provided that the student earned a grade of C- or higher for the course at CPC.
- Any course not on this articulation agreement will not transfer automatically to PUC. However, the student may elect to validate the course by taking a challenge exam at PUC. If the exam is passed the student will be granted full credit for the course.

Courses are placed on this articulation agreement after they are vetted by PUC faculty members. This list may be amended at any time.

PUC is on the quarter system and CPC is on the semester system. Conversion: 1 semester credit = 1.5 quarter credits.

The acceptance of a course for transfer credit at PUC for application to the PUC program does not guarantee that the course will transfer to another institution for application to that program. A student who plans to attend PUC and then attend another institution, such as a professional or graduate school, should consult with the other institution regarding the transferability of credit from CPC.
